

The Alderney eGambling (Amendment) Ordinance, 2008

THE STATES OF ALDERNEY, in pursuance of their Resolution of the 23rd day of July, 2008, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 6 of the Gambling (Alderney) Law, 1999, as amended^a, hereby order:-

Amendment of 2006 Ordinance.

1. (1) The Alderney eGambling Ordinance, 2006, as amended^b, is further amended as follows.

(2) In section 6(2)(b) (application costs), immediately before “repaid” insert “retained or, as the case may be,”.

(3) In section 8(2) (fees for licences and certificates) -

(a) in paragraph (b), for “£30,000” substitute “£10,000”;
and

(b) in paragraph (c), for “£5,000” substitute “£10,000”.

(4) In section 16(2)(b) (evaluation and testing costs), immediately before “repaid” insert “retained or, as the case may be,”.

(5) Immediately after section 16 insert the following section -

“Associates providing core services.

16A. (1) A full eGambling licensee may exercise its eGambling licence only if every business associate providing it with one or more core services as prescribed by regulations of the Commission made under this subsection holds a current associate certificate.

(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1), if within 21 days of first becoming an associate providing one or more core services to an eGambling licensee a person makes application for an associate certificate under section 4, until his application is determined by the Commission he shall be deemed to hold an associate certificate.”.

(6) In section 19(3)(b)(ii) (investigations), immediately before “repaid” insert “retained or as the case may be,”.

(7) In the definition of “business associate” in section 28(1), for “or management” substitute “, management or performance”.

Citation.

2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Alderney eGambling (Amendment) Ordinance, 2008.

Commencement.

3. This Ordinance shall come into force on the 1st October, 2008.
