

## **Multi-Jurisdictional Testing Framework**

The Alderney Gambling Control Commission is pleased to announce the completion of the first phase of the International Association of Gambling Regulator's (IAGR) working group project to develop a Multi-Jurisdictional Testing Framework (MJTF).

The AGCC has been working closely with gambling regulators in the UK, Denmark and the Isle of Man to assist our licensees and certificate holders in achieving the best speed to market whilst minimising regulatory duplication and games software testing costs.

Following this first phase of the MJTF, which includes agreement of commonly acceptable testing laboratory standards and randomness testing, AGCC licensees and certificate holders will likely soon also benefit from standardisation of game fairness testing, which the working group has already prepared in draft format for adoption in the next phase.

The MJTF project is an important step towards harmonising regulatory requirements across all IAGR jurisdictions, and we will continue to work actively towards further standardisation of games software testing requirements. The AGCC's technical standards are recognised as a model for egambling software fairness and customer protection, and our licensees and certificate holders will now enjoy further cross-jurisdictional benefits under the MJTF.
